As a kid I loved creating things with Leggo and drawing (and I still do). I can remember being on holiday in Nelson, NZ, with the family and drawing cars, caravans and campervans. My grandfather, a builder, always took a lot of interest in his grandchildren. He saw me drawing and advised, "don't draw cars – they rust out, draw houses they last a lot longer and are far more interesting."

Ever since then I have dreamed of being an architect.

The 1st year of Architecture at Auckland University was a huge shock for me.

I quickly realised that I didn't know what an architect was or what they did. The rug was pulled out from beneath my feet and I needed to survive. In my earlier Uni days I spent more time in pub music bands than serious architectural study. So much so that I was actually considering a career in music. I'm glad I followed through with architecture though. Once Uni was completed I found work in a small Auckland firm for half a year designing one-off private residences. The work was sporadic and dried up very quickly but I had a taste of a small design office and knew that being a sole practitioner was for me.

In early 2004 I completed my first private renovation, which gave me a lot of confidence – I could do this! I registered in Victoria in 2005, gradually taking on more private work.

The building process looked like such a fantastic and worthwhile thing to do that I had to try it out for myself. Currently I have a busy team of builders working on my own house.
