The aim for this project was to minimise noise whilst maximising privacy for the inhabitants of this tiny inner city cottage. Inspired by Japanese modernist architecture, a concrete bunker, which keeps the noise at bay, was created. The insertion of internal light courts, extensive use of skylights and the thoughtful placement of windows illuminates the internal spaces whilst offering privacy. Colour and timber have been introduced throughout the project creating an internal forest in a concrete jungle.




