

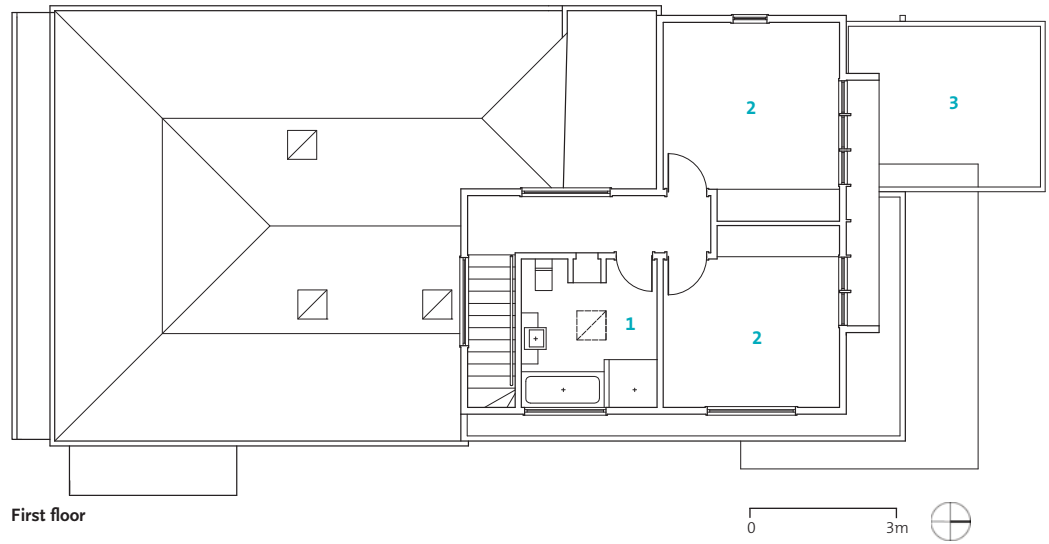

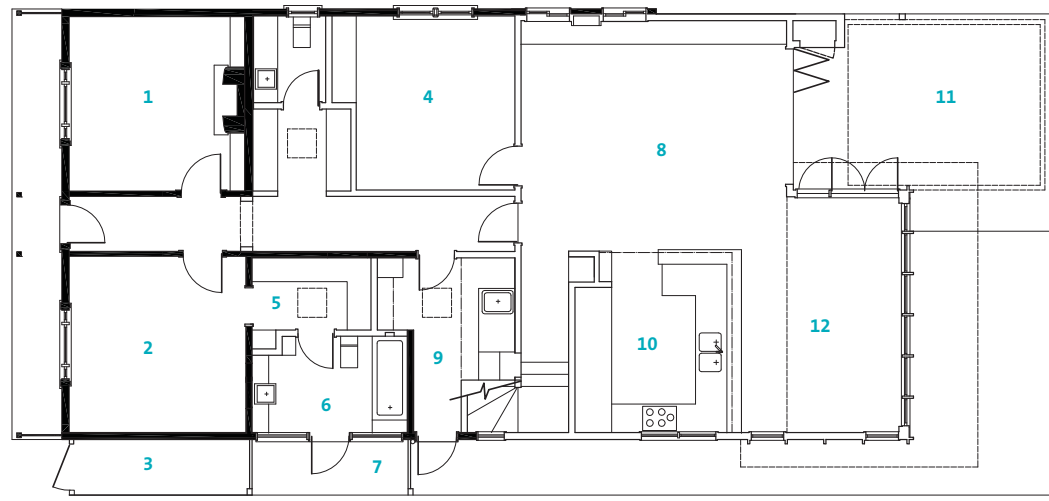

Paying respect to the original form was of utmost importance, as was designing and building a new space that was well and truly in the 21st century. Marrying the two in a sympathetic and respectful manner created both the challenge and excitement of this project. The brief included a three/four bedroom, two-bathroom house with a study. The living area consists of an open-plan kitchen/dining

room/lounge delineated by the use of plywood bulkheads.
